## Keyword Research Tools

There are several free Google tools that can be used for keyword research. A quick way to see popular queries for a given term is to type the word into the search box and Google Suggest will display the most common searches that contain that word.

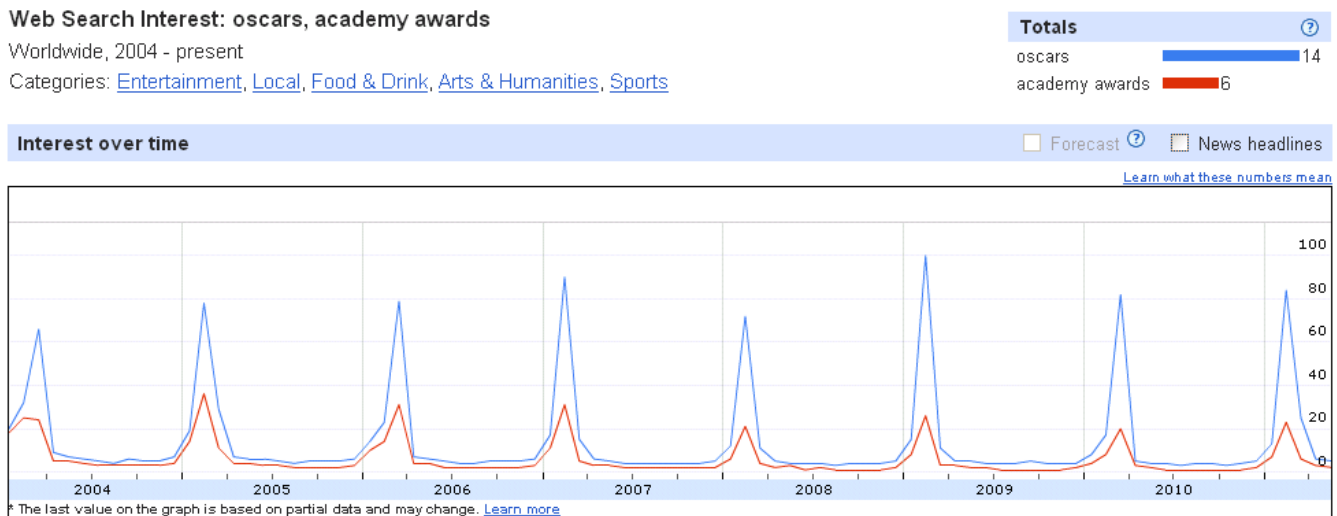

Enter a word or phrase into [Google's Insight tool](#) to identify recurring trends and compare the usage of two similar terms.



[Google's Keyword Tool](#) offers the most robust keyword research out of all these options. Enter your terms and you'll see the average monthly volume for a query based on the last 12 months. The "Global" column is worldwide and the "Local" column will align with the country and language you specify. It's important to understand that these numbers are inexact and the tool is best used to compare the volume of one term in relation to another.

## How to Write a Title Tag (SEO Hed)

The title tag becomes the link text in a search result page. It is one of the most important ranking signals.



This element must be specific & descriptive enough to convey to both searchers and search engines what a particular page is about without any additional context.

1. Clearly state what the page is about. If you were searching for this information, what words would you use? Use keyword research tools to determine how your customer is looking for your content or product. Place these words as close to the start of the tag as reasonable without compromising readability.
  - A review of Toy Story 3 the title tag should contain “**Toy Story 3 – Movie Review**”
  - An article is about filing taxes the title tag should contain “**Filing Taxes**” and the year
  - An article is about Ford recalling F150s the title tag should contain “**Ford Recalls F150 Trucks**”
2. Character limit including spaces is 70.
3. Do not overstuff with unnecessary repetitive words or overstate the point of the story (see [examples](#)).
4. Avoid ambiguity and compel the user to click without any additional context or cues (see [examples](#)).

## How to Write a Meta Description (SEO Summary)

This tag is used as the snippet of text displayed below a link on the search result page if it contains the words used in the searcher’s query. It’s very useful for providing additional information about the content and persuading the searcher to click on our page out of all the other links presented. Search engines do not use the meta description tag as a ranking factor.



1. Write a descriptive and compelling summary of the article.
2. Include relevant keywords and phrases.
3. Minimum amount of characters is 500 and maximum is 155 including spaces.

### Example

Excerpts from a leaked confidential document outline ways Google could profit from its vast databases of information and personal data and reveals an internal struggle around privacy.

The above example is good because it is descriptive, compelling and uses natural language while successfully incorporating all the relevant search terms a searcher might use to find this information: leaked, confidential, Google, personal data and privacy.
